TECHNIQUE TIP: Batting



Here is some information about quilt batting from the Hobbs Company. There are different processes used to make quilt batting. Garnetted or plain batting is run through a garnett or carding machine and then layered. It is not bound together and is very easy to quilt. Issue = potential for migration and shifting without quilting 1/4" to 1/2" apart. Needle punched batting is carded and then layered to form a web which is then run through needling equipment that mechanically entangles the web to lock it together. This gives strength to your project but maintains a soft hand and thinner profile. Needle punched wool or polyester can tend to migrate and can be thermal or resin bonded. Thermal bonding has a low-melt binder fiber mixed in so when passed through an oven it flows and bonds with the surrounding polyester fibers. Issues = surface fibers are not tied down and can migrate (work their way through front or backing) and these do not dry clean and break down faster with washing than resin bonded batting. Heat sealed products have heat applied to the surface of the web and it is sealed or glazed allowing the batt to open like a blanket and have good stability. Resin bonded batting is carded and passed through a process that applies a resin to both sides, then dried and cured for a bonded batt. This type resists bearding and is the most versatile and effective way to produce batting. To remove creases or wrinkles from packaging, you can place batting in the dryer for 5-10 minutes with a damp washcloth. Hobbs batting is made to be machine washable. If your quilt is color fast, wash on gentle cycle in warm or cold water and dry flat or in the dryer on low heat setting. If you feel the need to preshrink batting may be submerged in warm water in a bath tub then placed in the dryer on low seating. Do not wash. If you have fusible batting, layer quilt top, batting and backing. Set iron on wool or cotton setting with steam. Press from the center outward and keep iron moving 2-3 seconds in an area. This is a temporary fuse and you can reposition if necessary before quilting. The batting label should give you care instructions, shrinkage expectations, fiber content, and how closely you need to quilt

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
