TECHNIQUE TIP: More gadgets for stitching III A few more suggestions and we'll be done with the contents of our stitching bags. Some kind of ruler or tape measure is always a good thing to have on hand. A small retractable tape is most concise. A laying tool for when you want multiple plies of thread to lay side by side, especially when working on a canvas ground. A pair of good tweezers come in handy for removing errant fuzzies, hairs from your stitching or cut threads in Hardanger pieces. There are a few different thread straighteners. One is a short rod with foam on it. Another is a small plastic box with a damp sponge in it. Or the Thread Stripper serves the same purpose. These are used when a thread has folds or kinks in it from being wrapped around a card or need calming the "wirieness" as in rayon. Thread Heaven is a good thread conditioner that may be used help prevent tangling and help threads travel through the ground fabric more smoothly. Magnification for areas of detail that need enlarging. This can range from one that sits on the table, floor or hangs around your neck or just additional lenses that clip on your glasses or readers if you have contacts or don't normally wear glasses. A good light source may not fit in your stitching bag but is certainly a basic need to make your stitching easier and more enjoyable. It will also help to improve your product quality. I recommend a full spectrum bulb for truer colors and ease on the eyes. There is less heat generated from this type of bulb than a high intensity bulb. LEDs have a longer life than incandescent bulbs. And of course you need something to carry all your stitching gadgets in so they will be there when you need them. A mesh zipper bag or pouch, a Buddy Case with magnetic lids to hold scissor and needles or a custom sewn fabric bag will all work. Choose what you like best and start stitching!



CLASSES: If you would like to learn some specific technique or work on a specific project, let me know. We will schedule a custom class at your time choice and expertise level.

These are some of the classes we have offered before: counted cross-stitch, beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for quilting, fusible applique, crazy quilts, bargello quilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks. Just let me know your pleasure.




