Kissing Pillows HELP! Those of you who get email updates have already heard this, so for the rest of you, the Prairie Rose Chapter of EGA has taken on a new outreach project of providing a little kissing pillow for each child of the 1/133 Army National Guard unit that will be deployed overseas next summer. We would also like to send one with each soldier that leaves making our goal at least 1000. It helps to keep family close while miles apart. Fiberworks is furnishing fabric and floss to those who need it at no cost, except the postage to send it to you (\$1.40) if you are not close enough to stop in and pick some up We have them packaged in groups of six. If you have left over scraps of fabric and just need the pattern, send us a SASE and we will return it with the pattern. All you need to do is the simple cross stitch design on a 6" square of 14 count white or antique white aida with red, blue and white floss. After you return them to us, we will make them into pillows using patriotic themed material for the backing.

Class request/Open stitching: I have had a request for blackwork and Brazilian embroidery classes which will probably be held on a Saturday morning or a Tues, or Wed afternoon. If you are interested in joining the class please give me a call. Be sure to note on the class page other techniques we have done at classes and get two or three people together to set up a time for instruction. I will also offer open stitching as the holidays approach if you need a place away from home to finish gift items. The table will be kept cleared and you may also use my sewing machine if you need one. There should be space for at least 4 or 5 to work at one time.





TECHNIQUE TIP: Stitch Diagrams vs. Charts - How are they different?

A counted cross stitch design pattern is on a grid that looks like graph paper with a darker line every 10 squares to help make it easier to count stitches. The symbols within the boxes of the grid are different colors or different shapes to signify what color thread is used for each stitch. If the model has been stitched on linen or an evenweave fabric and stitched over two threads, each grid will represent two threads encompassed by one stitch. If specialty stitches are also used, there are most likely stitch diagrams separate from the graph. In the stitch diagrams, each thread of the fabric will be shown and numbers, letters, or arrows will be used to show the steps of how to do the stitch.

Hardanger designs are also shown on graph paper. Again, each square will represent two threads. If the lines for the satin stitches are graphed two grids long, they will be stitched over four threads.

Charted needlepoint designs use the grid lines as actual threads of the canvas. Lines showing where the stitches go will be drawn over the intersections. There will also be stitch diagrams to show you how to do the stitches. The needle will be brought up at the odd numbers and go down at the even numbers except for any eyelet diagram. For this stitch you will come up at each number and continue to go down in the center sharing the same hole each time. If a designer does not include stitch diagrams, there are a variety of books available with "how tos" for needlepoint stitches. (You should have one good one in your library!) With any of these charts it helps to have some method of keeping track of where you are working. Many people like to make an enlarged working copy and use a highlighter to color where they have already stitched. (Of course your working copy will be destroyed when you are done with it.) Metal boards with magnetic markers work good or clear plastic static cling line markers can be used on your pattern page. Then you don't have to spend lots of time remembering where you left off, especially if you are like me and may have short spurts of work in between longer periods of rest.




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Class Schedule: There is no formal schedule for classes in this newsletter. It takes a lot of time to plan classes, project costs, make models, etc. I have not been overwhelmed with the response from previous months' schedules. Either I am not choosing things you want to learn or offering a time you can come, so we are going to try "custom-made" classes. If there is some technique you would like to learn, call me at 319-352-5464 or come in to pick a project and schedule a time when you can come. I would like at least two people in a class, three or four would be more fun, so invite a friend or two to come with you. Costs will be set depending on the project materials and instructional book or pattern plus a small teaching fee.

These are some of the classes we have offered before: beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for quilting, fusible applique, crazy quilts, bargello quilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks.

If you already know how to do a technique but would like to pick a harder project or make a conscience effort to work on a specific one – new or already started, let me know and we can have a dedicated stitch-in with help available as needed. We offer a place to stitch without interruption from children, spouse, phone (if you turn your cell off) and have the expertise to assist you. You can bring a CD of your choice to listen to as you stitch if you wish. Learn something new this year and finish at least one started piece!

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INSTRUCTIONS FOR "Acom Fob"

Design is cross-stitched using 1 strand floss over 2 linen threads, unless otherwise indicated Note: When stitching with over dyed threads, cross or complete each stitch individually.

- Backstitch along border outline using 2 strands (Mahogany).

 Leaves are stitched in Smyrna cross using 1 strand (Attic Tea).

Finishing

Acom caps are satin stitched using 2 strands (Mahogany).

Use alphabet included to stitch your initials next to the single acom on backside.

Using 2 strands (Mahogany), overcast front and back together, inserting a twisted loop of cord at top and stuffing slightly with fiber fil.

Acorn Fob

Trim a 1/4" seam allowance and fold under along backstitch line on each piece.
