

I am sharing parts of an article that was on QuiltWoman.com blog - go there for other helpful info. Hobbies like sewing and crafting have long been recognized for their health benefits. Participating in arts is relaxing, engaging and can have significant health benefits. But quilting, a study by Glasgow University found, is "uniquely" good for you. The study concluded that the use of bright colors was uplifting, the activity distracted from the stress of work, and quilting offered challenges such as math and geometry. It also increased confidence and had an important social side in that the strong social network fostered the formation of strong friendships. Sharing with others and receiving positive feedback boosted self-esteem and self-confidence and increased motivation to improve guilting skills. Quilters in the study often donated quilts to charities/worthy causes and this gave their quilting added purpose. Making decisions like what dimensions to use and what size to cut the pieces are all left brain activities that help keep your mind sharp. The visualization of the project and decisions about colors, textures and types of fabric also contribute to good mental health. Relaxation was an important part of stress release. Pressing the fabric, cutting, piecing and quilting are all familiar, repetitive tasks that offer inner peace with a feeling of accomplishment when the project is finished.

While this study may have focused on quilting, I think you can see the same benefits from other needlework techniques. I know one of my customers said the doctor told him the repetitive motion of moving his arm while cross stitching was good for his heart. You just need to remember to get up and move around while you are working rather than stay in one position for too long. I know many of my best friends are those I have met through stitching. I'm a believer in the benefits.

**CLASSES:** If you would like to learn some specific technique or work on a specific project, let me know. We will schedule a custom class at your time choice and expertise level.

These are some of the classes we have offered before: counted cross-stitch, beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for quilting, fusible applique, crazy quilts, bargello quilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks. 

Designs called Amish with a Twist. It has sixteen solid colors on a black background and finishes to approximately 88" x 105". In the middle are 12 different geometric blocks set on point with a rail fence border and a floral applique on two corners. If you don't like to do applique you can leave it off and repeat the four patch block in the corners. It is a very cheerful looking piece and will be \$15.00 per month for 12 months. We will start as soon as I get the last colors in that it needs. If you are interested, please let me know so I can have enough patterns in stock.



Stitch Count: 48w x 39h 28 Ct. Flax Cashel Linen

#### Weeks Overdyed Floss

- Chestnut
- Collards
- Havana
- Honeysuckle
- Kohl
- Lancaster Red
- Pebble
- Whitewash
- DMC 310 Black -French Knot

Cross stitch and backstitch over two fabric threads using two strands of floss. When cross stitching with Overdyed floss, complete each stitch as you go to achieve the most color variation. All backstitch: DMC Floss #310 (one strand)

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
