

Help, I'm drowning in fabric! Save me. I've finished inventory of my quilting fabric and have pulled out bolts to make room for new ones. These have been marked down but I have no place to put them. Come in and take advantage of my lack of floor space.

TECHNIQUE TIP: Hand-dyed Threads for Stitching.

In the last newsletter I talked about hand-dyed fabrics so it is only fair to talk about threads next. There are several companies that make threads that are not a solid color. Different companies have different looks to their threads. (I will mention a few cotton floss brands here, but know that the names are not all inclusive as to threads available.) For example, most of the Gentle Art Sampler Thread colors stay within a color family and give a variation on one color. Grape Leaf is a nice medium green with a little lighter and a little darker green in the same skein. Crescent Colours floss also stay mostly in the same color with gradations of lighter or darker. Weeks Dye Works has some of both single family dyes and some that cross the line. In Confetti I can see blue, red, with touches of green and orange. Carrie's Creation threads seem to have more color variations even in the same family colors. We used her Epiphany on one of the shop models that was deep blues and plums. When colors are of a similar value your eye can blend them together when you look at it. A first glance it may seem to be a color in between the actual thread colors until you look closer to see the variation. Threadworx is another one that does both some of each same family and around the color wheel hues together in the same skein. Whenever you use a floss that changes color you will get the most bang for your buck if you complete each cross stitch one at a time, rather than working half the stitch across several and doing the other half on the return. This is because. depending on how long your row is, you may be to a different color by the time you get back to start. This will tone down the effect of the color change. It is difficult to make a conversion chart from a hand dyed to a solid color like DMC or Anchor since it may have several "solid" colors that make up one thread. If you want to convert you can pick the predominant hue, but be aware your finished piece will have a very different appearance than if you use a thread with variation built in. I have found if you are doing words or letters, it is harder to read if you use a thread that does not stay in the same color family. Hand dyes are more expensive than solid color floss but it is more work to make them that way and can be a great addition to your stitched project. Try some but be sure to get all you need from the same dye lot as they will vary!

CLASSES: If you would like to learn some specific technique or work on a specific project, let me know. We will schedule a custom class at your time choice and expertise level.


These are some of the classes we have offered before: counted cross-stitch, beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for quilting, fusible applique, crazy quilts, bargello quilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks. Just let me know your pleasure.

SIT AND STITCH - COME AND JOIN US!



Of course what bad weather we have had this winter always came on the fourth Thursday of the month, so we will try again now that it is nicer. "Sit and Stitch" will be on the fourth Thursday of the month, except for November which would be Thanksgiving, from 6 to 8 or however late you want to stay. During this time you can come to the shop and work on whatever project needs the most attention. I will also have a learning project if you wish to do that instead. I will try to pick something that will cost no more than \$10.00, less if possible. I will choose the first couple of techniques to get us started and the attendees can help choose the rest. The first one will be April 26th and will be a beading project. The next one will be May 24th and will be a knitting project. If you wish to do the learning project, please give me a call by the week before so I can have enough supplies on hand. If you need any assistance or have questions how to do things on your own stitching pieces, I can help you with those as well. I found a recipe for purple cupcakes, so you know I have to try those. I'll make some for April. Let's give it a go and see what develops!

There is one class I would like to offer to you. It is called Superior University and is all about trying different threads on small projects with your sewing machine. The first lesson would be \$47.00 which includes the lesson pattern, thread, notebook binder, Thread Therapy DVD, Top Stitch needles, Bottom line thread and Soft and Stable that is used in future classes. Each lesson after the first one is \$17.00. The projects take from 30 – 90 minutes to sew. We would meet the last Saturday of the month as each lesson is shipped mid month. There is no teaching fee for this one and you would furnish fabric pieces from your stash. For example lesson one uses Razzle Dazzle thread to make 4 mug rugs. You would need a fat quarter or quarter yard of fabric. Lesson two is a handmade greeting card that needs a 7"x6" piece of fabric and thin piece of batting sewn with Rainbows thread. Many projects will include a product or technique you may have never tried before. This will help you expand your knowledge and skills in sewing-related techniques and increase your knowledge and use of threads and related products which will add more possibilities to your projects. If we like these threads, I will add them to our inventory. I need at least six people to commit to a series of 12 to make this class a go. Give me a call if you are interested.


