

## **TECHNIQUE TIP: Knitting Needles**


What size and type should I choose? It will depend on the project, of course. Basically most needles come in wood, plastic or aluminum with some variations like glass (but what happens if you drop one of those?) Aluminum will change temperature with the weather - if it is hot your needles will be too, same in cold weather. Plastic and wood will be the same temperature. Aluminum, and to some extent, plastic will be slipperier than wood. If wood needles are stickier than you want - rub them with wax paper. Aluminum are usually less expensive. I personally like the bamboo needles. I think they feel good in your hand. For knitting the ruffle scarves that are currently so popular and have no size gauge, the bamboo are definitely better so the stitches don't slide off accidentally. Check the points of the needles. If your yarn is splitting choose a pair with more blunt points. If you are using circular needles, the appropriate length is the same size or slightly shorter than the circumference of the piece you are knitting. If you use needles that are too short, you will have trouble keeping all the stitches on the needle. If they are too long, the fabric will be stretched too taunt. If the cables between needles are kinky, put them in hot water for a short while and they will relax. When you start a project with circular needles, you may need to change to double points as you decrease like for the top of a hat. To switch, count the number of stitches and divide by 3 or 4, depending on how many needles you will use. Knit your next row changing to a new needle after you have knitted the correct number of stitches. It is always good to mark the first or last stitch of a row with a marker so you know where you started in the circle. When using double point needles, knit the first and last stitches of the group on each needle tightly so you don't make visible "ladders". No matter which type of needle you decide to use, learn to recognize a knit or purl stitch. It is easier to fix an error the sooner you notice it. The less you have to unravel, the faster you will get done. Remember to fix any dropped stitches or they will continue to "run". You can use a crochet hook to work the stitch back up to the current row rather than undo your knitting. I find knitting to be very relaxing and once you get in a rhythm and have the pattern repeat in your mind your speed increases.

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
CLASSES: If you would like to learn some specific technique or work on a specific project, let me know. We will schedule a custom class at your time choice and expertise level.

These are some of the classes we have offered before: counted cross-stitch, beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for guilting, fusible applique, crazy guilts, bargello guilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks. 


# FLOWER TAPESTRY


