We will not be open on Sundays this year, but we will be open on Mondays ONLY during June for this event. Be sure to look at the drawing prize list for those completing and turning in their passports. Both statewide and regional prizes will be given away. There are three exclusive fabrics for the 2014 hop which are available on a limited edition basis. (If you have one of our calendars this event replaces the Over 20 Shop Hop that was stamped on it in June.)

**Trunk Show:** Now on display are models from Erica Michaels Needleart Designs and will be here until June 28th. These silk gauze pieces are truly gorgeous – come in and look. We are selling patterns for the models at 10% off one or 15 % off two or



more. Notes on working with silk gauze: 1. Find the best lighting and magnification for you. 2. Work from the chart as you would any other counted cross stitch design but only do a half stitch instead of a full cross stitch. This should go faster since you are only doing half the motion. 3. Do the design first and then fill in the background last. 4. The holes in the gauze are actually bigger than the ground threads. 5. Designs can also be stitched on a fabric of your choice. Select a color to compliment the design and leave the background unstitched.

Regular hour change: As of July 1<sup>st</sup> our shop will be open until 5:00 instead of 6:00 on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. We will continue to be open until 8:00 on Thursday nights.



**TECHNIQUE TIP: Gadgets for stitching II** 

This is a continuation from the last issue on helpful tools you should include in your stitching bag. Clover's Thread Cutter Pendant is what I wear on a cord around my neck when I travel to use instead of scissors to cut threads. It looks like a necklace and passes airport security without a beep. It comes in either an antique silver or antique gold color with notches to access a small rotary cutter blade. A needle grabber can be a small rubber circle or a balloon works, too. This is used to give your fingers more traction when pull your needle through the fabric or canvas. You can get a hold of your needle easier if just the point is sticking out a bit when ending off threads on the back of your work. Ever have to take stitches out and you have lint residue from the removed threads? A Boo Boo Stick has two size brushes on either end so you can "sweep" off those pesky thread poops. An Ort Collector is a good thing to use to put the snippets you cut off in rather than putting them on the arm of your chair only to find you have leaned in them and are taking them with you wherever you go. There are some that straddle the arm of a chair or sofa with a weighted base. Some fold up to go with you. An empty, clean plastic oleo or yogurt container works for this, as well. You can also cut a hole in the middle of the lid and stick your needles in the area around the hole to park them. However, once the holes are used several times, they may expand enough that your needle drops down into the waste area - just use a new lid if this occurs or leave some thread in the eye to pull them out before dumping. A scissor fob not only helps you find your scissors when you drop them down between the sofa cushions, it helps you identify similar pairs when stitching in a group of people. My Big Toe makes lovely ones, long or short, using charms and Swarovski crystals. There are some that coordinate with the Gingher limited edition scissors. Counting pins come in handy when you are locating your place on your ground fabic. Use these instead of your needle so you don't lose your place when you have to move to the back side to take a stitch. These are usually straight pins or needles with a larger bead glued to the top to facilitate handling.





These are some of the classes we have offered before: counted cross-stitch, beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for quilting, fusible applique, crazy quilts, bargello quilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks. STITCH COUNT: 35 long x 37 wide DESIGN SIZE: 2 1/2" x 2 2/4"

Stitch with 3 strands over 2 threads on 28ct. Morning Glory linen (#76147) from Wichelt OR 28ct. Raw Cashel (#3281-53) from Zwelgart.

Backstitch Snowman's mouth with 1 strand of 3799. Snowman's eyes are French Knots stitched with 1 strand of 3799.

Lettering is stitched with 2 strands of 3799. 2 Small Gold Star buttons (3314.5) from Just Another Button Co. can be added to snowman's chest if desired.
