Thimbleberries Quarterly Club: I have the spring hanging pieced for the first quarter. Come in and take a look at this lovely piece and sign up on automatic for it and the other three quarters. The focal fabrics in this line are really nice.

TECHNIQUE TIP: Hand-dyed Fabrics for Stitching.

Looking for an extra touch to accent your cross stitch designs? Try using a hand-dyed fabric. There are several popular dyers from which to choose. Many have web sites so you can get an idea of color before you decide. Remember that color monitors can vary from actual and you will want to see the piece of fabric in person. Also pieces can vary each time they are dyed because there are many factors that can affect the final results. The brand of base fabric and the count will make a difference in color even when using the same dye formula. Higher count fabrics will usually come out somewhat lighter. Expect to pay more for a hand-dyed fabric - 4 ½ to 7 ½ cents per square inch compared to 3 to 4 cents for most single color linen or even-weave. While the first fabrics dyed were linens, now even-weaves and aidas are also available in hand-dyed colors. We have pieces from Picture This Plus, Lakeside Linens, Stitches and Spice (Australian), Weeks Dye Works (dyed to match their floss colors), R & R Reproductions, Zweigart (uses what was formerly Silkweavers for many), DMC, Stoney Creek, Wichelt, Glenshee, JAR designs, Fabric Flair, Crossed Wing Collection and Enchanted Fabrics. Each company has its own style. Some are hand-dyed in a single color overlay and some have multiple colors or processes. Some have stamped designs on one side only while others are actually hand painted. Be sure to look at both sides of your fabric piece to decide which side you like better. While a hand-dyed is not for every design, if it adds to the overall feel of your piece and doesn't over power it, try one. These are especially good when you want something to look "old" or antiqued. If you want to try your hand at dyeing yourself, a coffee or tea dye is probably the easiest. You can even dye the piece after it has been stitched if you want the threads to age as well. Just don't start a new company!;)







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CLASSES: If you would like to learn some specific technique or work on a specific project, let me know. We will schedule a custom class at your time choice and expertise level.


These are some of the classes we have offered before: counted cross-stitch, beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for quilting, fusible applique, crazy quilts, bargello quilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks. Just let me know your pleasure.

SIT AND STITCH - COME AND JOIN US!



We would like to establish a "Sit and Stitch" on the fourth Thursday of the month, except for November which would be Thanksgiving, from 6 to 8 or however late you want to stay. During this time you can come to the shop and work on whatever project needs the most attention. I will also have a learning project if you wish to do that instead. I will try to pick something that will cost no more than \$10.00, less if possible. I will choose the first couple of techniques to get us started and the attendees can help choose the rest. The first one will be February 23rd and will be a beading project. The next one will be March 22nd and will be a knitting project. If you wish to do the learning project, please give me a call by the week before so I can have enough supplies on hand. If you need any assistance or have questions how to do things on your own stitching pieces, I can help you with those as well. We can even try out some new recipes if you have some you'd like tried and have a bite to eat. Let's give it a go and see what develops!





Potato Baker Bags – finished size approx. $8" \times 9 \%$ " (We have fabric with baking potatoes on it that would be just right for these). You'll need: 1 piece 100% cotton fabric, 1 piece 100% cotton muslin fabric, and 1 piece 100% cotton quilt batting all $9" \times 21"$.

- Step 1: Place 9" x 21" pieces of fabric right side together with batting on top. Pin the 9" edges together.
- Step 2: Sew ¼" seam along both 9" sides (top and bottom) Then turn right side out and top stitch this seam.
- Step 3: Place on table with the outside of bag facing up and fold top down 2" and fold bottom up 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pin (only the muslin should show).
- Step 4: Pin together along the sides and stitch them together. The 2" lip is inside when pinned. Zigzag or serge edges if you want.
- Step 5: Turn bag right side out and turn the 2" lip over to the front side of the bag so it is right side out.

Here are instructions you can include if you make some to give away:

Baked Potato Bag

This simple bag creates a "just right" baked potato in your microwave. The inside is well done, yet moist, and the skin remains tender. The bag will cook from 1 -4 medium sized potatoes at once. Simply wash and dry your potatoes. DO NOT PRICK! Wrap the potatoes in a paper towel and place in bag. Microwave as usual. When serving, simply use a form. Potatoes will be very fluffy. Let the bag air dry after use.

Continue as needed with new piece of floss. When finished with the 9 rows, repeat, with rows in the opposite direction, creating the 'Reflection'. The 8 floats

on each side, are in the same floats for row 1

using 36" lengths.

Begin 9 floats from center to the right, row 1, leaving about 3-4" of thread.

Use 3 strands of floss or #5 Pearl Cotton, Cut fabric 3" X 7" Mark center Thread: VA12V1 Orange Blossom or VA12M7 Fall Leaves floss or SVA505 Toffee Peart Cotton Size 5 from Valdari and Witchelt Imports or Threadworx #1148 Romanian Forest

Mill Hill Treasure #12201 Autumn Maple Leaves

Fabric: 357-275 Tropical Orange Aida 14ct from Wichelt Imports

357-90 Provence Lavender 14ct DMC #102 Mill Hill Treasure #12305

Use other Wichelt Tropical 14ct Aidas:

357-271 Tropical Green 14ct VA12-575 Crispy Leaf Valdani Mill Hill Treasure #12287

There are so many lovely floss shaded colors and overdyes, it is fun to see how they fall into place creating the 'Reflection'. You will want to make several for friends and yourself.
