All That Jazz Block of the Month: It's not too late to do this six month block of the month from Grizzly Gulch using her lovely poppy print fabric. Finished size is 87" x 107" (queen size). The cost is \$30.00 a month for 6 months and includes the pattern and all the fabric for the front. We have a half sized model in the shop for you to see what it will look like. These can be mailed if you can't stop in each month to pick blocks up.



CLASSES: If you would like to learn some specific technique or work on a specific project, let me know. We will schedule a custom class at your time choice and expertise level.

These are some of the classes we have offered before: counted cross-stitch, beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for guilting, fusible applique, crazy guilts, bargello guilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks. Just let me know your pleasure.

MATERIALS

round washcloth

Add some style to your deaning routine with this fun

NOTES:

STITCH EXPLANATION:

Exact gauge is not essential to this project

Adjustable ring method: Wrap yarn around index finger. Insert hook into ring on finger, yarn over and draw up a loop. Carefully slip ring from finger and work the stitches of Rnd 1 (in pattern, below) into the ring. When Rnd 1 is complete gently, but firmly, pull fail to close up the ring. This design begins by working an adjustable ring to create a neat, closed center on the finished Washcloth.

WASHCLOTH Following the Technique Explanation above, make an adjustable ring Washcloth is worked in continuous mds. Do NOT join and do NOT turn at the end of mds

Rnd 1: Ch 1. Work 9 sc in ring; do not join. Place marker to indicate beginning of rnd. Move marker up

as each rnd is completed.

Rmd 2: Work 2 hdc in each sc around - 18 hdc at the end of this md.

Rnd 9: (2 do in next do, do in next 6 do, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp) 5 times, sI st in each st to end of md. Rnd 3: (2 dc in next hdc, ch 1, sk next hdc) 9 times – 18 dc and 9 ch-1 sps at end of this md Rnds 4-8: (2 dc in next dc, dc in each dc to next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk ch-1 sp) 9 times.

Weave in ends


