
May Special: From May 19 - 23, buy one ball of yarn and get another ball of equal or less value for 1/2 off.

Row By Row Experience: A heads up that we will be participating in Row By Row. This is like a nationwide quilters hop where each shop you visit, that is signed up, will give you a free row pattern. We will also have the license plate fabric pieces - ours is Born 2 Qlt. This will begin June 21 and run thru Sept 8 so if you travel on vacation look up shops on your way.

TECHNIQUE TIP: What's a "Fat"?

If you are new to quilting, you may wonder what a "fat" measurement is. When we get in a new bolt of fabric, we cut a yard's worth of fat quarters before it goes out on the rack = 4. A normal quarter vard is a piece 9" wide by the width of the fabric, most of the time, 44/45" long. A fat quarter is 18" by 22". We cut a half yard of fabric - 18" and then cut it in half width-wise making it approximately 22". In the same vein, a fat eighth is 9" x 22 instead of a normal eighth that is 4 1/2" x 44. Why? This gives you the same amount of fabric but in a different shape. If you need a small piece of fabric that is bigger than 9" a fat quarter might work better since you have twice as much width. Most shops are willing to cut you a fat quarter if they don't have one in a particular fabric. Some retail patterns are called "fat quarter friendly" in that they are made using several fat quarters of material. It is a nice size to experiment with if you are not sure if you like a particular fabric for a specific place in a project. Fat quarters are also great to collect to add variety to your fabric pallet (stash).


We sometimes buy cross stitch fabric in a fat half, especially of the more expensive hand-dyed varieties. Then instead of a piece 18" x 55", we have a piece 36" x 27.5" that is more square, Normally we have less waste cutting to size for projects when we start with this size rather than a normal half yard but have less upfront cost than if we order a whole yard. So now you know that a fat quarter does not need to go on a diet but is just cut in a different manner than a regular quarter.





These are some of the classes we have offered before: counted cross-stitch, beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for quilting, fusible applique, crazy quilts, bargello quilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks. SIT AND STITCH - COME AND JOIN US!


