**Super Football Sunday:** Join us on Sunday, February 7<sup>th</sup> from 12-4:00 before the big game kick off to tackle the deals at 25% off regular price items. Don't pass this event up!

**Block Stock Hop:** This is a new hop that will start February 1<sup>st</sup> lasting through April 30<sup>th</sup>. Each participating shop will offer a free quilt block pattern with a purchase. Setting patterns may be found on the Block Stock web site –

blockstock.net. Blocks are supposed to introduce you to the store. Our design started with the lowa Star block but we squashed it down so it isn't so pointy. We used fabric with sewing notions on it – scissors, threads, thimbles, measuring tapes, etc. In the middle of the block is a purple wave



since we have a purple store front and are in the city of Wave-rly, lowa and the Cedar River makes waves over the dam close by. We will have fabric kits available if you'd like to use our choice of fabrics to make the block, although, as always, you can also use fabrics of your own choosing. The blue in the wave signifies the other needlework techniques we also have supplies for, such as cross stitch and embroidery. You will also be entered into a drawing at each store you shop at for their prize package worth \$75.00. Your shopping can be either in the store, mail order or on our web shopping cart. Follow the hop on their facebook page just search for blockstock.


Jan 19-23 is Fat Quarter BOGO ½ off: Buy one fat quarter of quilting fabric and get one of equal or less value ½ off. Even better bring in something for the Pantie Raid and get one free for every package of undies or socks that will be given to the Cedar Valley Friends of the Family – a domestic abuse shelter here in Waverly. Let's pay it forward for these ladies that need our help. Since I am a little late in getting this newsletter out, we will extend the Pantie Raid through the end of the month.



February 16–20 Yarn BOGO ½ off: Works the same as the fat quarters – buy one skein or ball of yarn at regular price and get another one of equal or less value ½ off.

**March 15–19 Beading Supplies Sale:** These will be 20 % off. Beading patterns, thread, findings, beads and bead kits are all included. Try some of the new shaped beads.





#### **TECHNIQUE TIP: Pearl Cotton**

I am sure most of you know what embroidery floss is like - six strands that can be separated and put back together to adjust the thickness of the thread you want to use. You usually use two or three strands to do cross stitch depending on the count of ground fabric you are using. If you are using a larger count fabric, say 7 or 10 count, (these are really easy to see) you might want to think about using a pearl cotton instead of the floss. While you can use floss, you will have to make sure you keep the tension consistent on all of the strands. Pearl cotton comes in different weights and is not strandable, but used as it comes off the skein or ball. The largest one is a size #3 which I like to use instead of varn to tie guilts. I use a double thread for this. It isn't as fuzzy as yarn and is shinier in texture. The next size smaller is #5 which is just the right size for stitching over two threads on 18 count linen and for doing needlepoint on 18 count canvas. Both the #3 and #5 come in skeins. If you would like a smaller size there is an #8 and #12 that come on a ball. These are good sizes for doing Hardanger embroidery on smaller count fabrics. If you use 22 ct Hardanger fabric the size #5 should be used for blocks and #8 for filling stitches. Pearl cottons also work good for going around wool applique pieces with a blanket stitch. It is easy to adjust the size of the thread depending on how heavy a look you want.

DMC is the most common brand of pearl cotton and make pearls in many of the same colors as their floss. They do also make a size #5 in their Variation floss colors. Be sure to check availability if you are trying to substitute using the smaller weights, especially size #12, for floss. Valdani, made in Romania, makes pearl in sizes 5, 8 and 12 that come in both solid or hand-dyed, variegated colors. If you want a primitive or antique look, a hand dyed color works good. Weeks Dye Works, Threadworx and Classic Colorworks offer some of their floss colors in some of the pearl weights. Presencia makes Finca Pearls in sizes 3, 5, 8, 12, and a finer weight #16.

Pearl Cotton can be used for embroidery on stamped pieces, knitting and crochet when you want a fine yarn, punch needle, heavier tatting, crazy quilt embellishment, kumihimo cording and tassel making. I like to use #5 pearl for twisted cords for finishing stockings and ornaments as I can control the weight by adjusting the number of strands twisted together. These are all 100% cotton threads. Try it, you'll like it.



### SIT AND STITCH - COME AND JOIN US!



These are some of the classes we have offered before: counted cross-stitch, beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for quilting, fusible applique, crazy quilts, bargello quilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks. 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
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
