

TECHNIQUE TIP: Silk II

The last newsletter told of the origin of silk threads. This issue will talk more about different types of silk. Filament silk is made from the long unbroken lengths unwound from the silk cocoon and will have the maximum shine. Spun silk is made from the shorter pieces of silk left after the filament has been unwound from the cocoon. These threads will possess a subtle gleam and when used next to a filament silk will make it even brighter and more lustrous. From Au Ver A Soie we have several different types of silk. Filament silks include Soie De Paris (6 strand), Soie Perlee (3 ply twisted), Soie Gobelin (2 ply high twist). Soie Ovale (low twist) or flat silk. This one likes to catch on every area of unsmooth skin so be sure to use some lotion with no residue like Gloves in a Bottle before using this one. I used a laying tool. Spun silks are Soie d'alger (7 strand) and Soie100/3 (3 ply moderate luster). Use this last one when you stitch an area with fine details as it has a twist to give crisp definition. The Soie d'alger is loosely twisted so it is easy to ply to the weight you need to use like cotton embroidery floss. All of these threads are described as smooth, soft, lustrous with good tensile strength and resistant to abrasion. Silk Mori from Kreinik would be similar to the Soie d'alger. They also make a Silk Serica (3 ply filament) that is in between the weight of # 8 and #5 pearl cotton, and Silk Bella (3 ply finely twisted filament). Needlepoint Silk says their silk is reeled not spun so the filaments are longer and of higher quality. Rainbow Gallery has Splendor (12 ply) silk floss and Grandeur, Elegance and Subtlety that are the weight of pearl cotton #5, #8 and #12 in the same order. Most of these silks come in a large variety of colors with several in a color family so shading can be done with many values. If you would like a hand dyed silk thread, there are many brands of those from which to choose: Caron's Waterlilies (12 ply and Soie Cristale are their solids), Gloriana (12 ply), Silk N Colors (12 ply), Crescent's Belle Soie (12 ply), Dinky Dyes (6 strand), Needlepoint Silk Northern Lights (8 ply) and Vicki Clayton's Hand-Dyed Fibers (6 strand). Each brand has its own characteristic dye pattern. Some colors will cross color families and some will just be variations on the same color. These are just some of your options when it comes to silk threads. Be adventuresome and try one out on your next project if you haven't used silks before.





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
CLASSES: If you would like to learn some specific technique or work on a specific project, let me know. We will schedule a custom class at your time choice and expertise level.

These are some of the classes we have offered before: counted cross-stitch, beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for quilting, fusible applique, crazy quilts, bargello quilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks. Just let me know your pleasure.

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

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
