TECHNIQUE TIP: Color Wheel

We see the world in color, even dream in color. It can create happiness, sadness, be calm and cool or bright and bold. We tend to be conservative and match things, go neutral or buy in "sets" so that our choices are good ones. I've tried to help you see that quilts don't always have to be "matchy-matchy" to work as with a past BOM. A good tool to help with color choice is a color wheel. This has the three primary colors - red, blue and yellow placed equidistance apart with orange, green and violet (secondary) in between and further combinations of these colors (tertiary) in between, like red violet and blue violet on either side of violet. There are holes in the color wheel so you can place it over the item in question to see where it fits on the wheel. The center of the wheel turns to show which colors are directly across (complementary), equal distance, split complementary (points of a triangle on the wheel), warm (from red violet to yellow) or cool (from yellow green to violet) hues. The colors on the points of the triangle or corners of the square will always work together as will ones directly across from each other. Remember that darker colors will go into the background and light colors will come forward. Depending on what color scheme you are trying to make, the color wheel can help you out, whether you are choosing threads or fabrics, clothes or home décor. There is also a tonal color wheel with more muted colors on it that can be helpful when working with pastels.

Thank you to: The Blue Flower for the free chart. A note about the colors – DMC suggestions would be 610 for Chestnut Brown, 167 for Bronze Age Green, 948 or 754 for Cameo Crème, and 927 for NPT Silk. Moth Garden was a multi colored overdye and is no longer available. The closest cotton I could relate it to is Bethlehem from Weeks Dye Works. Feel free to adapt the colors to your own likes especially as to skin and hair color.

CLASSES: If you would like to learn some specific technique or work on a specific project, let me know. We will schedule a custom class at your time choice and expertise level.

These are some of the classes we have offered before: counted cross-stitch, beyond cross-stitch which would include adding specialty stitches, stamped cross-stitch/embroidery, canvaswork - needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, drawn thread, bargello, petite point on silk gauze, knotted work, smocking, temari balls, knitting, crochet, duplicate stitch, myreshka drawn work, tatting, bridge stitching (darning stitch), beadwork (peyote, herringbone, right angle weave, square stitch, brick stitch), huck embroidery (Swedish weaving), Brazilian embroidery, silk ribbon embroidery, punch needle, locker hook, stumpwork, blackwork, beginning piecing for quilting, paper piecing for quilting, fusible applique, crazy quilts, bargello quilts, felt applique, free lace for scarves/shawls, framing and mounting tips, finishing pillows, finishing standups, finishing in a box shape, tassels, etuis, stitch notebooks. Just let me know your pleasure.

We are using Mail Chimp to send the newsletters by email so you can manage your subscription through them. We do not share any of our customers' contact information with anyone.
