Tonga Nature BOM: We have the fabric all cut for this quilt and have a couple of kits not yet spoken for. If you'd like to join us, give me a call.





TECHNIQUE TIP: Needles

I have talked about different kinds of needles in the past but it has been some years ago. For counted cross stitch and needlepoint, a tapestry needle is used which has a dull point rather than a sharp needle. This is because there is already a hole in the ground fabric so you don't want a sharp point to pierce the ground threads but want to go in between them. There is a new style out from Sullivans that is supposed to be great for counted cross stitch. It is called the Easy Guide Ball-Tip Needle and come in sizes 24, 26 and 28. (Remember the larger the number the smaller the needle's diameter.) These needles actually have a small bump on the end of the needle that is said to facilitate going in between threads and helps you to not split plies of your floss as you stitch. Shall we review specialty needles? A "sharp" with a small, rounded eye is used for general sewing. A leather needle is not round on the end but triangular to pierce leather. A milliners needle is the same diameter the whole length of the needle so it is good for bullion knots. It is also called a straw needle and used for hand applique because it is longer than a "between", used for hand quilting, so it can flex as you tuck under the edge of the applique piece. The between is much finer and shorter so you can get smaller running stitches for quilting. The chenille and tapestry needles are similar in that they have a long oval eye but the chenille is sharp on the end and the tapestry is dull. The tapestry point is for needlepoint canvas and counted cross stitch fabrics where you stitch on either sides of the threads. An embroidery or crewel needle, or chenille, if you like a larger eye, would be used for embroidery on a ground that has no holes already in it. The eye of the size needle you choose should be 40% bigger than the thread that is going in it. This helps to keep the thread from breaking as you sew. This is especially important when using silk ribbon as you want the needle to make a large enough hole in the fabric that the ribbon doesn't get a lot of friction (wear) as it goes through the fabric. Choose the correct needle to make your "stitch" easier.



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Both designs are stitched on 14 ct. Antique Brown perforated paper; (PP3U) from Wichelt Imports, Inc.

To begin stitching, leave two rows on all sides of the paper. I find that it is easiest to begin stitching in the upper left corner. Use two strands of floss and a #24 tapestry needle.
