

Get your magazine with the passport, directory for shops and free patterns now so you can plan your route. You can reserve the limited edition fabrics that go on sale June 1. These include a Town Square panel that features famous landmark buildings in lowa, a fun winter landscape with

the Iowa State quilt star and county names. There are also several coordinating prints that go with A Winter Tour of Iowa designed by Amanda Murphy. The hop lasts thru July 31st. We will be open on Sunday, June 13th from 12-4 for the NE Region special day. Each shop (86 in the whole state) has designed a 4" block to give to each participant that comes in during that time. It only takes 5 stamps to be entered into a prize drawing – more entries for completing a region or the whole state. Each shop will also have an in-store raffle drawing.

Next T.O.M. begins January 2022: Instead of a block



of the month to make a quilt, we will be doing a table topper of the month. These will include Riley Blake fabrics for the top and binding plus the pattern all assembled in a nice boxed package. Each month will be



TECHNIQUE TIP: Knit one, Purl two.

Which needle shall I pick? Knitting needles come in several different sizes and materials. Wooden ones are often made out of bamboo, rosewood or birch. We carry the Clover bamboos since that is a renewable source and think it feels better in your hands. The yarn doesn't slide off accidentally as easily as it can off metal needles. Other materials are various kinds of aluminum, stainless steel and plastic. Single point needles come in pairs and are probably the most used. They come in 0000 (like using toothpicks) up to 15 (like using a medium dowel - think lacey) and lengths of 9" or 13-14". I have used the quad 0s with #8 pearl cotton to knit a little necklace size purse - don't drop any stitches or they will be hard to recover. Circular needles where there is a needle on each end of a connecting cable can be used if you have more stitches than will fit on the single points. They come in sizes 0-8 in 9"and 0-15 in 16", 24", 29" and 36" lengths and 48" in 0-10.5. Double point needles are for knitting in a circle rather than back and forth rows like socks. They are pointed on both ends of one piece and come in sets of five. You can split the stitches on some of the needles and start knitting with extra needle. Using a marker of some kind so you know when you have completed a circular row is most helpful. Some sets are available that have interchangeable points so you can make whatever length you need with which point size you need. There are specialty needles that glow in the dark or are lighted so it is easier to see in low light settings. Most are round but some are square after the point to the end. Some brands offer different point styles or points that are made to prevent splitting the yarn.

Use 2 plies of floss for cross stitches and backstitching. Do the stems in long stitches of 1191. Backstitching is in the same color as the leaves or flowers that are being backstitched. You could frame this, make an ornament or repeat on a 4 squares of fabric to make a pillow.

Treasure Chest Poncho

needles B

Treasure Chest DK for fringe, if desired gauge: 3 stitches

Treasure Chest for DK Poncho

YO = Yarn Over K2 tog = knit two together

60 Stitches on #13 needle or whatever size gives you gauge 3 * YO, K2 tog * repeat between * until last 3 sts K 3

Row 2: K 3, purl until last 3 stitches, K 3.

Row 1: K

Cast on

Repeat these two rows until piece measures 50 " long

Block poncho 20" wide and 50" long

Sew short side to Long edge matching A's & B's

Fringe if desired

wear this poncho many ways, over one arm, down the back, ect. Have fun.
