TECHNIQUE TIP: Beading Tips

Beading threads will stretch over time after they are in place so stretch them before you begin and use Thread Heaven or beeswax to condition it. If you have trouble knotting the end, you can cut a piece twice as long and put both ends through the needle and then put the needle through the loop to secure the thread on the first stitch on the ground fabric. When using the thread conditioner, put some on the cut end of the thread and flatten ends, trim squarely to create a fine blade to put through the eye of the needle. You might also try to moisten the eye of the needle rather than the thread end to help ease the threading process. A needle with a long eye will also help. Remember if the thread doesn't want to go through the eve to turn the needle around and try the other side. When needle eyes are punched out they thread easier from the leading side than the back. If you are using a 11/0 seed bead, especially Delicas, a #28 tapestry needle will usually go through them. Rather than trying to put the thread through the eye, put the needle on the thread. To help beads sit up on their edge rather than tipping to show the hole, use two strands to attach. The first pass will go through the bead and fabric and the second pass will come up in the same hole but split the threads so one goes on each side of the bead and go down through the fabric. These threads will snug up by the bottom of the bead and keep it standing up straighter. When ending a thread, run through a few stitches on the back of your work, take a back stitch and you can also tie a little knot to help keep things in place. If you have several beads in a row and want them to line up nicely, after attaching them individually, come up from the back on one end and run the thread through the line of beads before going down to the back on the other end. If you don't like to do French knots, beads make a good substitute. (Thanks to Nancy Cucci for compiling these suggestions.)


Materials needed:

- Kreinik Fine #8 Braid 150V, 152V, 5982, 202HL
- DMC embroidery floss 310, 898, 3821
- 14-count Aida in white 8" x 8"
- #24 Tapestry needles, scissors, embroidery hoop or q-snaps

Instructions:

Each square on the chart equals one fabric thread. Center and stitch the design centered on your fabric following the color key.

- Fine #8 Braid 150V Vintage Amber (1 strand)

- Fine #8 Braid 5982 Forest Green (1 strand)
- Fine #8 Braid 202HL Aztec Gold (1 strand)
- / Fine #8 Braid 5982 Forest Green (1 strand)
- / DMC 898 (1 strand)

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




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Pumpkin Pincurhion

Use your favorite linen to create this cute pumpkin pincushion. Outline the word Pumpkin, and the pumpkin itself in 720 Orange Spice Dark. Outline the stem in 988 Forest Green Medium. The curved lines on the pumpkin are chain stitched (see diagram below). Follow the chart for the exact placement of chain stitches. You may use backstitch instead of chain if you prefer. Stitch count is 45 X 45.
